.....Most people spend hours each week maintaining their outward appearance; they should do even more to develop their inner character. While everyone can see your face, only you and God know what your heart really looks like. What steps are you taking to improve your hearts' attitude?



At the Heart of the Matter (Part 2 of 6)



Next we'll go back to Matthew 23:1-7, and its explanation. Then Jesus said to the crowds and to his disciples, "The teachers of religious law and the Pharisees are the official interpreters of the low of Moses. So practice and obey whatever they tell you, but don't follow their example. For they don't practice what they teach. They crush people with unbearable religious demands and never lift a finger to ease the burden. Everything they do is for show. On their arms they wear extra wide prayer boxes with Scripture verses inside, and they wear robes with extra-long tassels. And they love to sit at the head table at banquets and in the seats of honor in the synagogues. They love to receive respectful greetings as they walk in the marketplaces, and to be called 'Rabbi.'" In the explanation we see that Jesus again exposed the hypocritical attitudes of the religious leaders. They knew the scriptures but did not live by them. They didn't care about being holy – just looking holy in order to receive people's admiration and praise. Today, like the Pharisees, many people say they know the Bible but do not let it change their lives. They say they follow Jesus, but they don't live by his standards of love. We must make sure that our actions match our beliefs.

From here we turn back to chapter 7 in Matthew, and look at verses 13 and 14 along with its explanation. Here, Jesus is teaching about the way to Heaven, and starts by saying, "You can enter God's Kingdom only through the narrow gate. The highway to hell is broad, and its gate is wide for the many who choose that way. But the gateway to life is very narrow and the road is difficult, and only a few ever find it." In the explanation of these verses, we see that the gate that leads to eternal life is called "narrow." This does not mean that it is difficult to become a Christian but that there is only one way to eternal life with God and that only a few decide to walk that road. Believing in Jesus is the only way to heaven, because he alone died for our sins and made us right before God. Living his way may not be popular, but it true and right. Thank God there is one way. I chose to use these verses in this message about the heart, because it shows that there is a very fine line of getting through the "narrow" gate into eternal life, while the road to hell is wide for its many travelers. And so are the motives of our deeds, and the thoughts within our own hearts, that they teeter on that fine line of doing acts that are truly Christ-centered or completely self-centered. To the point of before doing anything, we must ask ourselves, who is the benefactor of what I am about to do?
