Establish a "culture" for your life!

If you are a Nebraska Cornhusker football fan it has been a long season. Finally, after six losses in a row the football team won a game. Scott Frost the new football coach said he wanted to establish a new "culture" of discipline and commitment to Nebraska Football.

If you are going to make your life count you need to settle the issue of what is really important. Clarify the "culture" in your life. Moses in the Old Testament in the Bible clarified his values and priorities. Scripture tells us "He (Moses) regarded disgrace for the sake of Christ as a greater value than the treasures of Egypt, because he was looking ahead to his reward." Regarded, the word means to evaluate, to consider, to weigh in the balance, to judge. It is not something you do quickly. You need to sit down and seriously consider What in the world am I living for? You will need to establish values in life, things that you will build your life on, the things that will be important to you. Write them down!

We have a lot of Christians today who know the Lord, but they've bought into the world's value system. They're living that system without even thinking about it rationally. What is the world's value system? 1. Power and prestige. I want to be famous. 2. Pleasure. I want to Feel good. I want to be happy. I want to have fun. 3 Possessions. I want to make a fortune. I want to be wealthy.

All temptations fall into one of these three categories. Every advertisement in the world falls under one of these three categories. It's either an ad to produce pleasure or power and prestige or an ad for possessions. Every single advertisement is based on the worlds value system to get you into one of these things.

What is ironic is that Moses, by the world's standards, had it made. He had all three: Power. Pleasure. Possessions. He had it all but he walked away from it all. Moses walked away from the very three things we spend our lives trying to accomplish.

Why? Because he knew they don't last. What was Moses' value system? Three things: 1. He discovered that God's <u>purpose</u> is more valuable that popularity. Pride and prestige are fleeting. This year's superstars are next year's has-beens. 2. <u>People</u> are more valuable than pleasures. Moses could have had temporary pleasure being the next Pharaoh of Egypt or he could go do what God had called him to do and help the people who were in pain, who needed to be set free. 3. God's <u>peace</u> is more valuable than possessions. He knew that no possession could give you inner peace.

Your values are determined by your vision. What are you focusing on? Whatever you're looking at is what becomes most important in your life. As God's people let us stay, Focused to the cross... Following Christ's Love!

I guess the lesson I found in that experience is, that even though it's only a dollar, it still matters to do what's right in God's eyes. Even the little things we do, can have a great impact on our eternal life. It also showed me that no matter how hard I try, I can't out give God! Also note that my sole intention of printing this story is for how God is calling me to live my life according to his plans for me, and not as a form of boasting or bragging.

Treasurer's Report: Shela Jacobsen was unavailable to attend the meeting. President Dean Krohn briefly discussed details of the written report. Katie Collins moved to approve the treasurer's report, 2nd Dustin DeJong. MC.

Submission of current bills payable: none.

President's Report: no report at this time.

Pastor Eric's Report: There will be a graveside service for Dave Krohn on 10/13. Confirmation rehearsal will be held on 10/21 with 7 youth members being confirmed on Reformation Sunday 10/28. There will be 19 confirmands in the class of 2019/20. The financial needs of CAP (community action program) are especially great with the upcoming "Thanksgiving Basket" program where area families are given food items so they can enjoy a holiday dinner. It was moved by Margie Schenck and 2nd by Brenda Kelly that TLC would cover any shortfall in funds up to \$1500.00 for CAP programs. A copy of the new insurance policy for TLC is available in the office. It was moved by Josh Guyer 2nd by Dustin DeJong that TLC will pay to have the church carpets cleaned in late October/early November. Pastor discussed synching posts from the TLC Facebook page, Breeze software (esp. the calendar of events) and a new TLC web page to improve TLC presence on social media. Many people new to the area or visiting use these social media platforms when searching for a church to attend. Sue Paulsen will work with Darren Krohn on developing a web page. It was moved by Cristin Rold and 2nd by Brenda Kelly to implement these improvements.

Director of Ministry in Daily Life: From the written report, on 10/21 TLC youth will travel to worship in Council Bluffs and purchase some items for the Christmas Shoeboxes from area stores. On 10/24 TLC high school aged members will attend the Fields of Faith program at Tri Center High School. On 11/4 the LYO will meet for lunch and pack Christmas Shoeboxes using a \$250 donation from the Mt. Nebo Lodge. LYO will be selling 2019 calendars. NOTE: Sue will be out of the office 10/26 and 10/29.

Committee Reports:

Education: Cristin Rold reports large numbers of children are enjoying their Sunday School experience with help from several 7th and 8th grade members.

Outreach: Josh Guyer reported on progress with recruiting TLC members to serve on the Audio/Visual Team. New A/V equipment will allow TLC to greatly enhance the worship experience as well as insure that TLC worship events can be consistently broadcast via local cable channels. Financing the new system will be discussed at the next TLC annual meeting in January 2019. The weekly take home food boxes (aka weekend backpack program) has greater demand than is currently funded. Margie Schenck moved and Brenda Kelly 2nd that funding be increase to accommodate this need with funds coming out of the Benevolence Fund.
