Abide in My Love

We find John's allegory of Jesus as the "true vine" in the 15th chapter of the book of John. Jesus as the "true vine" is the means by which people are related to God. The "true vine" makes possible the existence of the "true people of God" by virtue of their "abiding" in Christ. Further, "to bear much fruit" is the evidence of a life of vital discipleship. Abba God is glorified through *fruitful discipleship*. Yet the disciples' fruit bearing is accomplished only through a mutuality of love that exists between Abba God and Jesus. This is the ungraced state of *being in Christ*.

Just as Christ lives and moves and has his being in Abba God. So we too as Christs' disciples derive this same meaning of being of believing by living in Christ. But this "being" is not a state of passivity, for in the vine life flows from the roots out to all the branches, they are not receptive and "cut off". The activity of the branches is to carry out the life of the main stem. They act in kind, just as the acts of Jesus are initiated and powered by the indwelling love of Abba God.

Everything in the love relationship of which John's Jesus begins with Abba God's love for the disciples: "As the father has loved me, so I have loved you, abide in my love" (Jn. 15:9). By ending their lives, Jesus brings the love of Abba God to them as direct experience, not as theological speculation. The life they have shared with Jesus has made clear the love of Abba God in a real and unprecedented way. But how is a disciple to remain in that way? The word of truth is that the believer enters into communion with Abba God by *keeping Jesus' Commandments*, just as Jesus has been faithful in keeping the commandments of Abba God. The primary source of joy is in keeping the commandments is the fundamental commandment: to love. Disciples are to love one another just as Jesus has loved us, which is seen most clearly in the way of self-sacrifice. But, before any of the disciples can "lay down their lives for their friends", Jesus must first lay down his life for them. Their paradigm of love rests completely on the initiative of God in Christ, a love which reaches its fullest on the cross. Yet Jesus makes it clear that their discipleship is not something they planned and executed. Jesus chose them and charges them with a purpose. John's Gospel makes no stronger statement on the election of our purpose than here.

As we "abide in Christs' love, Christs' love abides in us". When the disciple brings his or her will into conformity with Abba God's will, which is love, the empowerment to love cannot help but spill out of our hearts when we are in Christ Jesus!

.....When he was working in the fields close to home, I was usually able to find him after I would get home from school and finish out the day working with him. But when he was over at the Tennant farm, I had no way to get there, so trips there were very limited.

Say What?? (Part 3 of 8)

As the weather warmed up, the ground preparation had been completed, and it was time to get the crops in the ground. Dad had gotten all of his own ground planted, and he was ready to head west with the tractor and planter and get started over there. It was mid to late morning on a Saturday, and as soon as he was ready to go, he came and found my brother and myself. He explained that he was ready to get the tractor and planter over to Tennant, and that he needed me to follow him in the pickup so that he would have a way back home. The request was nothing new to me, and as usual, it was not presented to me as a question, but more as a statement, "I need you to follow me over to Tennant in the pickup". Previous to this, I had followed him plenty of times in the process of moving equipment from farm to farm. Not only on the country roads, but occasionally also on the highway. Whenever we would have to travel on the highway, he always told me that if we should ever get stopped by the police, that I should not get nervous or scared, and that he would handle everything. Fortunately I can say that that situation never occurred in all the times we moved equipment. So, Nolan and I got ready to pile in the pickup and make the trek over to Tennant. Now what he used for a farm truck, was a 72 GMC with a 4 speed manual transmission. The original bench seat had been removed, and the seat out of a Cadillac had been installed in its place. But in doing so, the new seat could not be adjusted closer to or farther away from the steering wheel. Being only 11 or 12 years old, I couldn't reach the clutch for starting the truck or shifting gears. So, I would have to start the truck in gear, which was always a bit jerky until the motor would come to life, and I could use the gas pedal to get it moving. Another challenge that the truck presented was that it didn't have power steering, just the old fashioned way with elbow grease. So, off we went. Dad with the tractor and planter, and Nolan and I in the truck. We made our way down the gravel road to Highway 59, just north of what is now Wings and the Cobblestone Inn. We headed North on the highway, and at the bottom of the hill what is now Regional Water, we turned West and headed down the gravel road towards the river. At the time, Dad had just gotten a newer planter which was an upgrade from a 4-row to an 8-row planter, and due to its size, the marker arms were longer and stood up higher when being transported down the road. As we approached the river bridge, Dad brought the tractor down to a snail's pace because the construction of the bridge had metal frame sides which included a metal frame cover as well.
