The Leveling Factor

There is a family that had two sons. The younger of the two brothers was a little wild. As he grew up he spent his money loosely and caroused with women. As life became more confusing for him he began to drink a lot. By the time he was 35 he had blown all his money. Early on he turned his back on his family, and handed them one burning insult after another. It wasn't surprising at a young age he ran away from home taking with him all that he had, and all that he had coming to him. From there he sank to the lowest levels of society.

Fortunately the family had another son, an older son. He was just the opposite. He did all the right things. He stayed at home and worked hard at caring for his parents. He was always at his fathers side to help. They went to church as a family every week. He was the kind of son who did what you expected him to do. He always followed through on what he was expected to do.

After several years spent in the gutters of the city the younger son began to see the mistakes he had made. He felt like a fool for the way his life had turned out. So he decided to turn around and go back home. It took a lot of courage to face those people that he had insulted and defied. But he decided to go home and try to make things right. He knew he deserved nothing – and as he returned he asked for nothing.

When he got home he was shocked to find his father received him warmly. His older brother did not. The older brother was so angry when he came home, that he wouldn't even talk to him. The older brother was resentful.

Besides, the older brother was planning to take over the father's business all by himself. As events unfolded the self-righteousness, the arrogance, the greediness of that, apparently pure and good, older brother was seen for what it was.

The difference became more and more apparent between appearing to be good and actually being moral.

This is, of course, an adaptation of the story of the parodical son. It points to the fact that those who appear to be good, moral and righteous sometimes hide bad motivations. Sometimes those that appear to be evil are not as bad as they seem. Appearances can be deceiving.

How do we decide about morality? How do we set our moral standards so appearances don't make a difference? How do we live as the Lord wants us to live? Keep our eyes on Christ Jesus Always!

- -Also upon entering the sanctuary, you will see hand sanitizer and masks for your use. The council voted that it is highly recommended that attendee's wear masks while in attendance.
 - -Pews have been marked every other pew for use. Families are asked to sit together.
- -After service concludes, please be patient upon exiting to give others space to exit and exit thru the North door. Please maintain 6 feet of distancing as each situation allows.

If you are sick or experiencing any symptoms of COIVD—Please STAY HOME!

Here are a few of the changes that have been implemented during worship:

- -There will continue to be no greeters, acolytes, ushers, communion assistants, support, or Altar Guild.
 - -Choir will not gather, but rather, will have one to two worship leaders during services.
 - -There will be no sharing of the peace.
- -Communion will be given in individual communion packets and taken in unison in our pews, when supplies are made available.
- -There will be no passing of the plate, but offerings may be left in the plates in the back of the sanctuary upon entering or leaving. Text to give at 712-248-4488 is still also a great option.
 - -There will be no coffee cart.
 - -There will be no bulletins for services.



TRINITY'S FIVE & DIME




