

THE HEALING OF HIS SEAMLESS DRESS

"If I may but touch his garment. I shall be healed." These words in Matthew 9:21 invite us to study this case. When a young person engages in the study of medicine or law, one case after another helps the person learn what they need to know in years to come. In the study of the facts about Christ this method works equally well. In the gospels and elsewhere in the Bible the materials for case studies abound. Today they appeal to the eye of the soul. If only for the sake of simplicity, they bid us to look at one person in the presence of the beloved Physician.

Christ alone does the healing but only in response to the touch of faith. He wishes us to think of faith as human need laying hold of divine power. Today, as of old, he stands in the midst of life's struggles. Among all of us he has a way of singling out the one who most desires the healing touch of his dear hand. In the case now before us he blesses without even touching the needy friend. So does he stand in our midst now, tender to sympathize and mighty to save.

In the house of God we can lay hold of Christ's garment. In the music from the key board and in the songs by the people we can become aware of the presence that heals. In the reading from the scriptures and in the words of prayer we should behold the Healer of the broken hearted. In the preaching of the gospel and most of all the table of the Lord we can find peace for our souls. "Earth hath no sorrows that heaven cannot heal", right here and right now.

We see the difference between the touch that heals and the many that presses. Which way do we come close to the Master's seamless dress? "oh," one answers, "often I join the many of those who jostle against the Lord Jesus." All the while I long to be whole. I have tried and tried to touch the hem of his garment, but I do not know the way. Please you tell me how.

Quit trying to find a perfect way! Try trusting him to bless, however you come! Remember that the healing power rests with him and that he wishes you to reach out by faith, it matters not how. With the eyes of faith you can see some way in which he reveals his presence. With the hand of faith you can reach forth somehow to touch the hem of his garment. Then you will know the peace and joy that filled the heart of that timid woman who whispered to herself, "If I may but touch his garment, I shall be healed."

Doing Our Best to Help Ensure a Safe Worship Experience!

As with most gatherings, worship here at TLC will look differently than it has in the past. Please do your part to respect the guidelines and to be respectful of our neighbors and the diversity of opinions on the guidelines while in church.

-Please enter for worship thru the West doors. Please note that those doors will open only 10 minutes prior to service. You are encouraged to find your seat promptly upon entering.

-Also upon entering the sanctuary, you will see hand sanitizer and masks for your use. The council voted that it is highly recommended that attendee's wear masks while in attendance.

-Pews have been marked every other pew for use. Families are asked to sit together.

-After service concludes, please be patient upon exiting to give others space to exit and exit thru the North door. Please maintain 6 feet of distancing as each situation allows.

If you are sick or experiencing any symptoms of COIVD- Please STAY HOME!

Here are a few of the changes that have been implemented during worship:

-There will continue to be no greeters, acolytes, ushers, communion assistants, support, or Altar Guild.

-Choir will not gather, but rather, will have one to two worship leaders during services. -There will be no sharing of the peace.

-Communion will be given in individual communion packets and taken in unison in our pews.

-There will be no passing of the plate, but offerings may be left in the plates in the back of the sanctuary upon entering or leaving. Text to give at 712-248-4488 is still also a great option.

-There will be no coffee cart.

-There will be no bulletins for services.

Can't See The Forest For The Trees

So, now that I've painted a pretty vivid picture, I'll get to the heart of this story. I'd like to say that I made this discovery on my own while reading the Bible, but I can't claim that it happened in that way. Maybe the door was opened just enough for me to get a glimpse of what waited on the other side, and Jesus did the rest. I'll let him explain it to me some day. But after I had been given eyes to see and ears to hear, the lesson in those verses brought tears to my eyes, and they still do to this day. Once you've been moved, it's difficult to be removed. It's something that just stays with you. So, onto God's word which comes out of the book of Mark. Mark 1:32-39, and Mark 2:1-12 which reads: That evening after sunset, many sick and demon possessed people were brought to Jesus. The whole town gathered at the door to watch. So Jesus healed many people who were sick with various diseases, and he cast out many demons. But because the demons knew who he was, he did not allow them to speak. Before daybreak the next morning, Jesus got up and went out to an isolated place to pray. Later Simon and the others went out to find him. When they found him, they said, "Everyone is looking for you." But Jesus replied, "We must go on to other towns as well, and I will preach to them, too. That is why I came." So he traveled throughout the region of Galilee, preaching in the synagogues and casting out demons. When Jesus returned to Capernaum several days later, the news spread quickly that he was back home. Soon the house where he was staying was so packed with visitors that there was no more room, even outside the door. While he was preaching God's word to them, four men arrived carrying a paralyzed man on a mat. They couldn't bring him to Jesus because of the crowd, so they dug a hole through the roof above his head. They lowered the man on his mat, right down in front of Jesus. Seeing their faith, Jesus said to the paralyzed man, "My child, your sins are forgiven." But some of the teachers of religious law who were sitting there thought to themselves, "What is he saying? This is blasphemy! Only God can forgive sins!" Jesus knew immediately what they were thinking, so he asked them, "Why do you question this in your hearts? Is it easier to say to the paralyzed man 'Your sins are forgiven,' or 'Stand up, pick up your mat, and walk'? So I will prove to you that the Son of Man has the authority on earth to forgive sins." Then Jesus turned to the paralyzed man and said, "Stand up, pick up your mat, and go home!" And the man jumped up, grabbed his mat, and walked out through the stunned onlookers. They were all amazed and praised God, exclaiming, "We've never seen anything like this before!"
