#### **Beam Me Up Heavenly Father!**

For many of us we know more about Scotty beaming up the crew members of the starship Enterprise than we know about the Ascension of our Lord.

At the time of Jesus' ascension to heaven, forty days after his resurrection, May 30<sup>th</sup> this year, he commissioned his disciples to proclaim repentance and forgiveness of sins, in his name, to all nations – starting at home in Jerusalem. "You are witnesses of these things," Jesus said, "And see, I am sending upon you what my father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high". (Luke 24:47-49.)

Jesus never made it a secret that he would return to heaven after his resurrection. He told his disciples this even before he had been arrested. The disciples were understandably concerned. With Jesus not physically among them, who would teach and remind them, encourage and guide them? How would they continue Jesus' ministry of teaching and healing without his powerful presence?

Jesus replied, "...the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you (John 14:26). He added, "When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, he will testify on my behalf" (John 15:26).

The power from on high was the Holy Spirit that arrived with wind and flame – signs of the presence of God easily identified by Jews – at Pentecost. And from then on, the disciples were filled with power to continue the ministry of Jesus. Without Jesus' ascension, God's plan would not have been complete, and the promised Holy Spirit would not have come. Without the Holy Spirit, the faith may well have died with the 11 disciples (who were paralyzed with fear) and the unnumbered women devoted to Jesus. Ascension Day keeps us tuned in to God's plan and prepares us for the blessings, promise, and power of the Holy Spirit that helps us make Christ known today.

So before you are "beamed up", to eternal life through faith in Christ Jesus, let the Holy Spirit flow through you for Gods' purpose in the world today!

.....Then Peter called to him, "Lord, if it's really you, tell me to come to you, walking on the water." "Yes, come," Jesus said. So Peter went over the side of the boat and walked on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw the strong winds and the waves, he was terrified and began to sink. "Save me, Lord!" he shouted.

Say What?? (Part 7 of 8)



I too had done like Peter had done. As long as I could see what was familiar and focused on it, I felt safe. But as soon as I shifted my focus on to something else, something that was unfamiliar, I was filled with doubts and fear, and I started to sink. My fears were becoming larger than my faith and I was reaching out for anything that would save me. At the beginning of this story, I mentioned that we would come back to Moses and his excuses. When God had enlisted Moses, and gave him the details as to what he was to do, Moses did everything he could do and come up with reasons and excuses why God should choose somebody else for this mission. That is part of our human nature to backpedal as much and as quick as possible to get back into our comfort zone. Almost to the point where we put more effort and energy coming up with reasons why we shouldn't do what we are being asked to do. I have tried to look at these situations from a whole other view, and for the most part it has helped in stepping forward in accepting difficult missions. When I get presented with an opportunity that requires me to step out of the boat and out of my comfort zone, instead of looking for the reasons why I shouldn't do this, or for the reasons that I find myself inadequate to complete the task; I only have to look to God and understand that he knows that I can do it. He trusts in me that I can do it. He has faith in me that I can do it. He knows me, and knows what I am capable of doing and not doing. We should find the peace of mind and confidence that God has asked us to do his will. Run to him in his faith, and not run from him in your fear. God does not call the qualified to do his work, He qualifies those that he calls. Some of God's biggest story makers also felt unqualified for their tasks, but as you read the Bible, you will see that with his assistance and persistence, they were able to succeed in their missions. We should not disqualify ourselves from service to Christ because we do not have the expected credentials. Being a good disciple is simply a matter of following Jesus with a willing heart. Here are a few scriptures and explanations (from my Life Application Study Bible) that I felt helped give some support on the subject. Psalm 132:2-5; He made a solemn promise to the Lord. He vowed to the Mighty One of Israel, "I will not go home; I will not let myself rest. I will not let my eyes sleep nor close my eyelids in slumber until I find a place to build a house for the Lord, a sanctuary for the Mighty One of Israel." This scripture refers to David's desire to build the Temple.
