
We like happy endings. We like to imagine a world of love and peace and harmony and compassion for one another. The way life ought to be. Unfortunately, reality isn't quite like that. We share with St. Paul that idyllic hope of a world patterned after the life of Jesus himself. Listen to St. Paul's words:

"So if there is any encouragement in Christ, any incentive of love, any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfishness or conceit, but in humility count others better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but also to the interests of others. Have this mind among yourselves, which you have in Christ Jesus." Philippians 2:1-5.

Notice, first of all, that St. Paul begins with Christ. So in other words he is telling us that if we have ever found Christ's support in an hour of need, if He has ever refreshed your spirit and given you the ability to hold on, then complete Christ's joy by being of the same mind. The words Paul uses in the original text picture Christ coming and standing by our side to comfort, console, to encourage as only Christ can.

St. Paul is not counseling the church at Philippi simply to be nice to one another. He longed for them to be transformed to a new creation, to have the mind of Christ as their mind. Wow! Wouldn't it be great if all churches could be like that? If Christ has brought you any encouragement, St. Paul is saying, any love, affection, sympathy – then pass that encouragement on to those around you. Let us be committed to a Christ like ministry of encouragement!



....I will not let my eyes sleep nor close my eyelids in slumber until I find a place to build a house for the Lor, a sanctuary for the Mighty One of Israel." This scripture refers to David's desire to build the Temple.

Say What?? (Part 8 of 8)



When David became king, he built a beautiful palace, but he was troubled that the Ark of the Covenant, the symbol of God's presence among his people, remained in a tent. This so bothered David that he couldn't sleep until he corrected the situation. He began to lay the plans for the Temple to house the Ark. (Eventually the Temple was built by his son Solomon.) We must live so close to God that we become restless until God's will is accomplished through us. Psalm 139:16; "You saw me before I was born. Every day of my life was recorded in your book. Every moment was laid out before a single day had passed." God planned our birth and our existence for a very particular place in time and for a very particular purpose and reason that only we are to fulfill. It's up to us to be ready to hear God's calling and accept the task that he needs us to complete. Ecclesiastes 6: 10; "Everything has already been decided. It was known long ago what each person would be. So there's no use arguing with God about your destiny." God knows and directs everything that happens and he is in complete control over our lives, even though at times it may not seem that way. How foolish it is for us to contend with our creator, who knows us completely and can see the future. Exodus 4: 10-13 (one of Moses' attempts to get out of the trip to Egypt.) but Moses pleaded with the Lord, "O Lord, I'm not very good with words. I never have been, and I'm not now, even though you have spoken to me. I get tongue-tied, and my words get tangled." Then the Lord asked Moses, "Who makes a person's mouth? Who decides whether people speak or do not speak, hear or do not hear, see or do not see? Is it not I, the Lord? Now go! I will be with you as you speak, and I will instruct you in what to say." Moses pleaded with God to let him out of his mission. After all, he was not a good speaker and would probably embarrass both himself and god. But God looked at Moses' problem quite differently. All Moses needed was some help, and who better than God could help him say and do the right things. God made his mouth and would give him the words to say. It is easy for us to focus on our weaknesses, but if God asks us to do something, the he will help us get the job done. If the job involves some of our weak areas, then we can trust that he will provide words, strength, courage, and ability where needed. So for whatever reason or task the Holy Spirit is calling you into action, try not to find the reasons to not take action, but look to the words of Isaiah in chapter 6, verse 8: Then I heard the Lord asking, "Whom should I send as a messenger to this people?
