The Embarrassment of Thanksgiving

There is something embarrassing about it all...about Thanksgiving Day, I mean. For when we set aside a day of special thanksgiving, are we not thereby admitting somehow we have failed to give thanks as we ought throughout the year and that we need a day to kind of catch up on our thanksgiving? But can you ever catch up on your thanking?

In the very word, thanksgiving, is the thought that it should be spontaneous, that it should be expressed freely, without its having to be urged. The moment we make a point of reminding someone to be thankful, does not that very urging take the edge off thanksgiving?

On the whole, our family thanksgiving will be a delightful one, as all holidays are. For the Christian, the added dimension of the "holy day" adds to the delight. There is the family gathering, with family and friends, to spend the day with us. Dinner in the late afternoon. It's the traditional menu, turkey, dressing, pumpkin pie and all the trimmings, as we say. And before we sit down to this festive meal there is the prayer.

But after all these efforts on our part the nagging question still remains, and we would be driven to despair were it not for another embarrassing moment in history when an innocent man was hanging on a cross. He looked down on those who had been responsible for putting him there. Then he looked up and prayed, "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do."


When we think about what our Lord did for us on the cross, this brings the one note of solemn joy to thanksgiving, that while living under the judgement of God, a judgement far too complex for us even to comprehend, we have the assurance of forgiveness.

The embarrassment of my thanksgiving is met only with the embarrassment of Good Friday, where we see the yearning heart of a God of love. The Psalmist expressed it this way in the great Thanksgiving Psalm: "Like a father has compassion on his children, so the Lord has compassion on those who love him. For he knows us; he remembers that we are dust."

Perhaps only after I have experienced this embarrassment can I pray with meaning, "O give thanks unto the Lord; for he is good: for his mercy endures forever. O give thanks unto the God of gods: for his mercy endures forever. O give thanks to the Lord of lords: for his mercy endures forever."



The whole area was a buzz with the news, and things seemed to be going very well for them, gaining in popularity, crowds probably getting larger by the day, and then Jesus tells them, we're out of here. It's time to move to other towns and preach. I'm guessing that his disciples were kind of taken by surprise by this abrupt announcement. And so it was; they packed up and traveled on. We then find them in Capernaum preaching in the house that he was staying in, and as usual, there are "experts of religious law" within the crowd. And as we know, they didn't much care for Jesus and his teaching, and were always trying to catch him with trick questions or story problems. And then all of a sudden there seems to be some activity happening up on the roof. Once again, it's guessing on my part that this was probably an unusual and potentially disruptive activity. And just like that the paralyzed visitor is plopped down on the ground right in front of Jesus, and without anything said by anyone, Jesus declares that the man's sins are forgiven! I'm sure that his four friends whose heads are all peering through the hole that they had just made to get their friend in there are all looking at each other saying something like, "Did I just hear him right? Did he just say 'Your sins are forgiven.' Is that all he's going to say and do? Why did we just go through all this trouble if that's the end of it?" And for the rest of the people in and around the house listening. What did they think? "Is that all he's got for this poor paralyzed man? How will we know or be able to tell that his sins are forgiven?" And then the "experts or teachers" of religious law; what was going through their minds? "There he goes again, forgiving sins! Who does this man think he is? Only God can forgive sins!"
