


A Season of Waiting

TRINITY'S FIVE & DIME



Glory to the Lord our God, for his never failing love. And for sending his son, Jesus Christ, to be our Savior and redeemer. This we praise in your Holy name, Amen.

I want to push the pause button momentarily on the current Five and Dime series, and do a single article in honor of the birth of Jesus, and the Christmas season.

When we think about Christmas and Jesus, we quickly turn to images in our mind, and the story of Jesus' birth recorded for us in the Gospels. But, I would also like to say that the whole Bible points to Jesus, more than just what we tend to think of from the Gospels. In the Old Testament, he is predicted. In the Gospels, he is revealed. In Acts, he is preached. In the Epistles, he is explained. And in Revelation, he is expected. So, with that thought in mind, I would like to point out some scriptures to confirm that statement. (Prediction) Psalm 132:11-17 it reads — "The Lord swore and oath to David with a promise he will never take back: 'I will place one of your descendants on your throne. If your descendants obey the terms of my covenant and the laws that I teach them, then your royal line will continue forever and ever.' For the Lord has chosen Jerusalem; he as desired it for his home. 'This is my resting place forever,' he said. 'I will live here, for this is the home I desired. I will bless this city and make it prosperous; I will satisfy its poor with food. I will clothe its priests with godliness; its faithful servants will sing for joy. Here I will increase the power of David; my anointed one will be a light for my people." And in Isaiah 7:14 it says, "All right then, the Lord himself will give you the sign. Look! The virgin will conceive a child! She will give birth to a son and will call him Immanuel (which means 'God is with us')." (Revealed) In Matthew 16: 13-20 we see, "When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say that the Son of Man is?' 'Well,' they replied, 'some say John the Baptist, some say Elijah, and others say Jeremiah or one of the other prophets.' Then he asked them, 'But who do you say I am?' Simon Peter answered, 'You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'You are blessed, Simon son of John, because my Father in heaven has revealed this to you. You did not learn this from any human being. Now I say to you that you are Peter (which means rock), and upon this rock I will build my church, and all the powers of hell will not conquer it. And I will give you the keys of the Kingdom of Heaven. Whatever you forbid on earth will be forbidden in heaven, and whatever you permit on earth will be permitted in heaven.' Then he sternly warned the disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah." (Preached) Acts 9:17-22 says, "So Ananias went and found Saul. He laid his hands on him and said, 'Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on the road, has sent me so that you might regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit.' Instantly something like scales fell from Saul's eyes, and he regained his sight. Then he got up and was baptized. Afterward he ate some food and regained his strength. Saul stayed with the believers in Damascus for a few days. And immediately he began preaching about Jesus in the synagogues, saying, "He is indeed the Son of God!' All who heard him were amazed. 'Isn't this the same man who

caused such devastation among Jesus' followers in Jerusalem?' they asked. 'And didn't he come here to arrest them and take them in chains to the leading priests?' Saul's preaching became more and more powerful, and the Jews in Damascus couldn't refute his proofs that Jesus was indeed the Messiah." (Explained) In Galatians 3:23-29 we find this, "Before the way of faith in Christ was available to us, we were placed under guard by the law. We were kept in protective custody, so to speak, until the way of faith was revealed. Let me put it another way. The law was our guardian until Christ came; it protected us until we could be made right with God through faith. And now that the way of faith has come, we no longer need the law as our guardian. For you are all children of God through faith in Christ Jesus. And now that you belong to Christ, you are the true children of Abraham. You are his heirs, and God's promise to Abraham belongs to you." (Expected) In Revelation 21:1-7 we find the following, "Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the old heaven and the old earth had disappeared. And the sea was also gone. And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down from God out of heaven like a bride beautifully dressed for her husband. I heard a loud shout from the throne, saying, 'Look, God's home is now among his people! He will live with them, and they will be his people. God himself will be with them. He will wipe every tear from their eyes, and there will be no more death or sorrow or crying or pain. All these things are gone forever.' And the one sitting on the throne said, 'Look, I am making everything new!' And then he said to me, "Write this down, for what I tell you is trustworthy and true." And he also said, "It is finished! I am the Alpha and the Omega - the Beginning and the End. To all who are thirsty I will give freely from the springs of the water of life. All who are victorious will inherit all these blessings, and I will be their God, and they will be my children." And in 22:6-7 is says this, "Then the angel said to me, 'Everything you have heard and seen is trustworthy and true. The Lord God, who inspires his prophets, has sent his angel to tell his servants what will happen soon." "Look, I am coming soon! Blessed are those who obey the words of prophecy written in this book."

These are just a few examples that can collaborate with the statement I had made at the beginning. So, as we approach the birthday of our Savior, let us continue to seek him throughout the entire Bible, and strengthen our personal and loving relationship with him. The Son of God, the Prince of Peach, the King of all Kings, invaded our earthly world in the most unexpected and least royal methods. There was no triumphant fanfare, no pomp or pageantry. Just the dirty, and dingy surroundings of a stable. And that same King of Kings left our earthly world in the most disgraced, and shamed method imaginable. And again, there was no triumphant fanfare, no pomp or pageantry. Just the cheers and jeers from angry mob demanding his life as he was nailed to the cross. God gave us Christ in a cradle in Bethlehem, because God knew that Christ on a cross on Calvary was coming. And in almost every picture that I see the nativity scene in, I see the foreshadowing of Christ's crucifixion. The very same sign that led the wise men to Jesus, the Bethlehem star; in a large number of pictures shows that star in the shape of a cross. The sign that announced the birth of the Son of god, also predicts the death and method of how he would die. Glory be to God, as we continue to focus on the cross.
