

Are you having a stress free spring? Experts say that one of the greatest causes of stress in our lives is **WORRY!** If you don't worry, don't read on: If you worry read on.

We all have pet worries: finances, jobs, relationships, marriage, kids, health, etc. There are three problems with worry. Worry is <u>unhelpful</u>, it's <u>unreasonable</u>, and it's <u>unhealthy</u>. What good is it?

It's <u>unhelpful</u> because it never accomplishes anything. It is stewing without doing. It's like racing your car engine – you create a lot of smoke and noise but you don't go anywhere. Worry never solved a problem. Worry cannot change the past, control the future, and only makes us miserable today!

It's <u>unreasonable</u>. It exaggerates your problems, makes mountains out of molehills. The more you worry about something the bigger it gets in your mind. To worry about something you can change is silly – change it. Either way, don't worry!

It's <u>unhealthy</u>. The body was not made to worry, it's unnatural. When you worry you get ulcers, backaches, headaches, insomnia. Our bodies were not made to worry. Plants and animals don't worry. The only thing that worries in God's creation is people. The good news is that if worry is learned it can be unlearned.

If I let the Lord be my Shepard how is that an antidote to worry? What does a Shepard do? A Shepard *provides, protects, guides,* and *corrects.* The amazing thing is this: God has promised to do these four things in your life if you'll thrust Him. Won't you let Him be your Shepard?

Karen Armstrong <u>OBE FRSL</u> (born 14 November 1944) is a British author and commentator of <u>Irish Catholic</u> descent known for her books on <u>comparative</u> <u>religion</u>.^[1] A former Roman Catholic <u>religious sister</u>, she went from a conservative to a more liberal and <u>mystical</u> <u>Christian</u> faith. She attended <u>St Anne's</u> <u>College, Oxford</u>, while in the convent and majored in English. She left the convent in 1969.^[1] <u>Her work focuses on</u> <u>commonalities of the major religions,</u> <u>such as the importance</u> <u>of compassion and the Golden Rule</u>.

One of the books is *Fields of Blood: Religion and the History of Violence* We all have heard more people have been killed in the name of Religion than any other reason. Karen Armstrong goes to great lengths to dispel this theory. For example the thirty years war was more about boundaries than about religion.

A call to order was made by Alan. He opened the meeting for President Kathy Soetmelk that could not attend. There is not a quorum present so no motions will be made this evening.

Thank You cards were written to show our appreciation for good deeds to: Tom & Mary Rock for a very generous donation to the Sunday School program, and to Rose Sternberg for making 54 Easter masks for the Sunday School.

A motion to approve the agenda was not made. A motion to approve the minutes of the last meeting was not made.

Shela gave the Treasurer's Report. A motion was not made.

Pastor gave his monthly report. He asked if we were aware of anyone sick or in the hospital. Upcoming events are: April 18-Madden Baptism, May 5 will be the last day of confirmation, May 9 will be the last day of Sunday School and on May 2, we will be honoring our Seniors at the 10:15 service. Love On The Cross (Part 2)

Agape, is described as charity. This is our chief aim, the unconditional love of the Father given to us through his Son. Affection, friendship, and romantic love are each the training ground for charity to grow. It's also a rival to the three. C.S Lewis reminds us that, all humans pass away, and that we are not to put our goods in a leaky vessel. But yet, we are made to love and we are in want of it. If we play it safe, stay within the comfort of a safe boundary, and keep to ourselves what we've been blessed with, then we are not living out what the Gospel says, and demonstrating the parable of burying the coin safely in the ground.

Lewis goes on to say: "There is no safe investment. To love at all is to be vulnerable. Love anything, and your heart will certainly be wrung and possibly be broken. If you want to make sure of keeping it intact, you must give your heart to no one, not even to an animal. Wrap it carefully round with hobbies and little luxuries; avoid all entanglements; lock it up safe in the casket or coffin of your selfishness. But in that casket—safe, dark, motionless, airless—it will change. It will not be broken; it will become unbreakable, impenetrable, irredeemable. The alternative to tragedy, or at least to the risk of tragedy, is damnation. The only place outside Heaven where you can be perfectly safe from all the dangers and perturbations of love is Hell. If we think that perhaps love is not worth the sorrow and pain, then we are more pagan than Christian. Though the fall has invited such selfishness to linger heavy in our culture, ours is the Gospel charge – to go to the nth degree to love those who are broken, not for some vague humanitarian effort, but to make disciples of all nations, 'Baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you.' (Matthew 28:19-20) Let us ask God to awaken such and abandoned and reckless love to come alive in us."

As I contemplated this agape love that Jesus has for us and how that looks to me, I think I can best describe it as Jesus' character; to love in this way is to treat, or care for someone who can do nothing for you. Isn't this also how we are showered with God's mercy and grace? Mercy is when God spares us from the bad things we deserve. Grace is God giving us the good things we don't deserve. And blessings are when He is generous with both.
