### Lighting the Way for Others

When Ida Nelson, head tribal clerk of a remote Alaskan village, heard an airplane flying low after dark, she knew something was wrong. Igiugig (Igggy-yaw-gigg), population 70, isn't normally a nighttime destination. Indeed, the medevac flight was coming to pick up a sick child.

Because the local airstrip's lights had been vandalized, the plane was having trouble landing. Nelson began alerting neighbors, and within minutes, villagers lined the runway with their vehicles, headlights blazing. The pilot was able to land and then safely deliver the sick child to an Anchorage hospital. The airlift service praised the residents' determination, but Nelson describes their effort as "normal" and "ordinary."



In either case, I would have a hard time hearing that from my son.



### (Jesus and His Parables)

Welcome to 2022! I hope that everyone had a joyous and memorable Christmas celebration, and felt the love of Christ amongst family and friends. I'll turn the pause button off on the previous Five and Dime article, and try and pick up where I had left off. We had just read the parable of The Prodigal son, and some thoughts on it. From my Study Bible, one of the explanations given is this: "In the story of the lost son, the fathers' response is contrasted with the older brother's. The father forgave because he was filled with love. The son refused to forgive because he was bitter. His resentment rendered him just as lost to the father's love as his younger brother had been. Don't let anything keep you from forgiving others. If you are refusing to forgive people, you are missing a wonderful opportunity to experience joy and share it with others. Make your joy grow: Forgive somebody who has hurt you." And in another explanation: "In Jesus' parable, the older brother represents the Pharisees, who were angry and resentful that sinners were being welcomed into God's Kingdom. "After all," the Pharisees must have thought, 'we have sacrificed and done so much for God.' Who easy it is to resent God's gracious forgiveness of others whom we consider to be far worse sinners than ourselves. But if our selfrighteousness gets in the way of rejoicing when others come to Jesus, we are no better than the Pharisees." When I hear and think of the several messages that are being said in this story of The Prodigal Son, I am reminded of a story that I heard about a Pastor who had just delivered a very stirring, and uncomfortable sermon. One that was filled with an extra helping for fire and brimstone. And as the congregation was dismissed and was filing out of the sanctuary to greet their Pastor, most of the congregation was quiet as if just receiving a mild, but stern scolding from their parents. But one particular church member greeted the Pastor with a firm handshake, and with an expression on his face that could almost resemble a smile, said to his Pastor, "You really let them have it today Pastor." And he proceeded on out the door. Oh how easy is it to do to see the faults and short-comings in other first before we recognize those same issues in our own lives. We hear or read the Word of God, and can guickly pick names out of our internal address book who we think should take notice of that particular scripture or passage. I have often felt that when I read the Bible, I should read it in front of a mirror. Not as an act of vanity, so that I can see myself doing it to build up my pride; but that when I get to those "difficult to take" types of scriptures, that I should first see myself and apply it to myself. And run it through my heart, before placing it on the shoulders of another person.



O Lord Jesus Christ, heavenly King, thank you for bringing both Jews and Gentiles to hear your voice. Enable us to follow your holy Word, as those from the East followed the leading of a star. Give us grace to confess your holy name. Rule us by your Spirit, so that the joys of your birth may increase in us. Hear our prayers and cries. Accept our offerings, which you yourself have given us: the gold of our faith, the incense of our prayers, and the myrrh of our contrite hearts. Deliver us from the destructive ways of sin, and lead us in the ways of peace

and in the paths of righteousness. Grant us all, when this life is done, a participation in the joys of the Year of Jubilee in heaven, where we shall praise and serve you and the Father who live and reign in unity with the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.
