

(Jesus and His Parables)

As we continue to look at some of Jesus' parables, I think I'll conclude this Five and Dime series with the parable of the ten bridesmaids. We find this one is Matthew 25:1-13, and it reads: "Then the Kingdom of Heaven will be like ten bridesmaids who took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. The five who were foolish didn't take enough olive oil for their lamps, but the other five were wise enough to take along extra oil. When the bridegroom was delayed, they all became drowsy and fell asleep. "At midnight they were roused by the shout, 'Look, the bridegroom is coming! Come out and meet him!' "All the bridesmaids got up and prepared their lamps. Then the five foolish ones asked the others, 'Please give us some of your oil because our lamps are going out.' "But the others replied, 'We don't have enough for all of us. Go to a shop and buy some for yourselves.' "But while they were gone to buy oil, the bridegroom came. Then those who were ready went in with him to the marriage feast, and the door was locked. Later, when the other five bridesmaids returned, they stood outside, calling, 'Lord! Lord! Open the door for us!' "But he called back, 'Believe me, I don't know you!' "So you, too, must keep watch! For you do not know the day or hour of my return.

Procrastination. I think that is something that all of have dealt with at some point in our lives. And maybe others, like myself, more often than we'd like to admit. I would say that the heart of this one, the lesson Jesus is trying to teach the crowd that has gathered, along with his disciples is that everyone needs to have their spiritual relationship with him in order. We must not get into the habit of always thinking, or relying on that there will be a tomorrow. Pastor Eric would sometimes back that thought up with the saying, "Why do today, what you can put off until tomorrow." So often that the pressures of today's world, the numberless activities, and our everyday snags and obstacles, all clamor for our attention. And it is very easy to give way to those things, because they are always staring us right in the eyes, and they are our immediate needs. But for the most part they are temporary and empty, and are not eternal; which is what our eyes are to be focused on. Now that's not saying we need to discard our obligations to be responsible individuals. But we should to try and put things into a prospective that our Heavenly Father would approve of. So be prepared, and do not delay in that task, for you too may run out of olive oil.
