


A Living Mystery

....And the last weapon that Paul is telling the church in Ephesus to use is prayer, and I would say that it is used as both an offensive or proactive weapon, before the battle begins; and also as a defensive weapon. So pray before, during, and after your spiritual battles, and pray with persistence!



"Lord, teach us to pray" Luke 11:1 (Part 2)

Continuing with Paul as our focus on prayer, we find that there are five areas, or qualities that he prays for his Ephesian brothers and sisters, and are good areas for us also to use for our prayers. #1 – Pray for focus, #2 – Pray for hope, #3 – Pray for riches, #4 – Pray for power, and #5 – Pray for love. So, #1 – Pray for focus. Blindness and sightedness, they are 180 degrees apart from each other. You cannot be blind and have sight at the same time. That is also true for the eyes of our heart as well as for the eyes in our head. In that famous song, Amazing Grace; the hymn writer John Newton, who was a slave trader that turned pastor, he penned the lyric "I was blind, but now I see." That became his testimony as he went through his conversion. Also in that same sense, Saul of Tarsus also was blind, but could finally see. When he met Jesus, on his way to Damascus to round up more of the early Christians, Jesus blinded him with scales that covered his eyes. Then Jesus spoke to Ananias, a believer of Christ, and sent him to talk to Saul. And in Acts 9:17-18 it says: "So Ananias went and found Saul. He laid his hands on him and said, "Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on the road, has sent me so that you might regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit. Instantly something like scales fell from Saul's eyes, and he regained his sight. Then he got up and was baptized." The scales falling from his eyes was emblematic of the spiritual transformation that Saul experienced as he realized, so Jesus is alive. So Jesus is real. So Jesus is Lord. He had been blind, so blind that he fought the light and had been arresting Jesus' followers. But now he saw. Saw so clearly that he followed the Light of the world and proclaimed him throughout the known world. And so, the common theme that runs through Paul's writings to the Ephesians is this: "Without spiritual sight, we'll see nothing that truly matters. And he prays for both non-Christians and believers alike in Ephesians 1:16-18, "I have not stopped thanking God for you. I pray for you constantly, asking God, the glorious Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, to give you spiritual wisdom and insight so that you might grow in your knowledge of God. I pray that your hearts will be flooded with light so that you can understand the confident hope he has given to those he called – his holy people who are his rich and glorious inheritance." Your heart is the very center of your existence - your core. It's the headquarters of who you are and what you are – your mind, your emotion, your will. And you need the eyes of your heart opened wide and focused well.
