A Pulled Tooth

For some time, I have had a molar that was cracked, infected, creating bone loss, and most likely has been the cause of a four-month sinus infection that has been uncurable. Today, I finally had it extracted (good word) and now am beginning the healing process. "You know it don't come easy," Ringo Starr sang, and often I agree. Here is the life of faith.

I struggle for the Church today that many things have crept in, again, as always, that seem to be good and yet are a dangerous infection that, left untreated, could cause great harm. Though people will say, "I know I am a sinner," the lived-out experience of that (because of our condition) seems to somehow not to mesh with the statement. If I understand scripture as well as Martin Luther's work clearly, I am left with only one central point from which to begin, (Eph 2:12, 2:3, Jam 4:4. Jn 8:44, Augsburg Confession article 2, Rm 3:23, Isa 53:6.....) and yet people in our time more than perhaps a long time, are living, acting, and worshiping as if we are some how standing on a level place with Jesus, and therefore God. Baptism is taken as an insurance policy and faith life is in honestly held as a given rather than an active participation, which, if I read the bible, it clearly states otherwise. In short, I am NEVER not in need of a Savior, even though I am baptized and have a life of faith... Just as the father cried out to Jesus, "Lord, I believe, help my unbelief" here is where it begins.

My tooth, like me, was just fine as I moved along. I ate, I drank, I laughed, I lived. It was all good. It took a visit to the dentist with an x-ray, examination, and a sharp implement to reveal to me that my tooth had a crack in it that had apparently allowed an infection to grow for some time. A root canal was of no value as the infection was in my blood and I was losing bone in my jaw. (Ewe, I know) The tooth would need to be extracted, medication administered, and healing and learning to live without that tooth (grieving) would need to happen so that I can be well. But it took going to the dentist and for him to diagnose and announce to me my condition and the means of healing, otherwise I would have just kept on going and....

So here is why our gracious, loving God calls us to worship, to study, to live lives of worship and sacrifice that all point us to Him. I need to come into God's presence. And He is a God who is more willing to be merciful and gracious than exact "punishment," but He is also a God who is JUST and declares to me the truth so that I might be made – whole. Just like the dentist, God's word must come to us from the outside to break in and open us to see what we would otherwise deny, "I am the chief sinner." God lovingly calls us to come, sit, and hear His life-giving Word for our life as we are fed with heavenly food in word and sacrament. Just as you to talk to your children about things that are to benefit them for a moment, a lifetime, and for eternity, God wants to talk with you about things He knows you might not acknowledge. Just as you teach and raise children, God speaks with two words – Law and Gospel, which together are grace. For example, like my dentist said – you have a cracked, infected tooth that must come out because it is making you sick (law) BUT – I have all the tools to heal and clear that from you to live better though different than before. (gospel)

So why then are the parts of faith that are most needed to begin the healing process, worship, study, service, so often pushed out of our lives and prioritized lower for "more important things?" Because I stand, by nature, opposite of God and really want nothing from Him other than what can help me with in this moment. There never is a time when I can stop coming back to this realization of my desperate need, and therefore God's more that abundant and bountiful response to me despite my condition. "So, faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ." Romans 10:17

The world is, with our participation and denial, pushing what is most important for eternity to the side and background, using the same deceit as in the Garden so long ago. "Did God really say? You will not die..." God's word must be heard to open me, piece by piece, to move ever closer to Him and to live more in what He has already given to me in my inheritance. I need to see the great healer and physician and though I might not like it, I must hear so that He can move me from sickness to health. Because we are all covered up with it, yep, every one of us. And, yes, it can be painful. Yes, it can be hard. What

....Because it is very surprising that God would choose us. We should be amazed that the love of God for us goes back into eternity. That before he created the world he set his love upon us.



"Lord, teach us to pray" Luke 11:1 (Part 4)

That despite our complexities and our flaws and our failings, God still loves us, and he drew us to himself. We don't deserve that. It's by faith, which is a gift from God. Paul was unceasingly thankful for all that God had done, and he purposefully remembered this in his prayers. And we must be thankful too, for ourselves and for those we know who have faith, for it says God has blessed his people "with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places". The unfortunate problem is that quite often we don't see it, or get that. And so in Ephesians 1:16-18, Paul prays for what these early Christians have, and that they might see it. "I have not stopped thanking God for you. I pray for you constantly, asking God, the glorious Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, to give you spiritual wisdom and insight so that you might grow in your knowledge of God. I pray that your hearts will be flooded with light so that you can understand the confident hope he has given to those he called – his holy people who are his rich and glorious inheritance." And just like these early Christians, we too don't always see this, and so Paul is praying that the eyes of our hearts will be opened. Paul's not praying for "new sight", but for a focused sight. He's praying not for his readers to become Christians, but to enjoy all that is theirs as Christians. He knows about their faith in the Lord Jesus and their love toward all the saints. He's giving thanks that God has opened their eyes to see who Jesus is, but Paul's not settling for just that. He wants more for them. Faith in Christ is first of all a decisive act, and then it is a sustained attitude. It is to have your heart-eyes opened to who Jesus is and what he has done; and then it is to have your heart-eyes more and more focused on the glory of Jesus, so you live more and more in light of that. Paul wants us to understand and enter into the benefits that we have already received. Too often as Christians, we live like someone who has been given a full-board ticket on a cruise ship, and who sits on their deckchair eating crackers and drinking water because they haven't realized that all the food is free with their ticket. They never go to the restaurant because they haven't understood just what it is that their ticket includes. They're on the boat – but they're not enjoying being on the boat. Paul is essentially saying, you need to know, you need to see, that you've been given "every spiritual blessing". Not one. Not some. Every one. That's what transforms you, both inside and outside.
