

The SELF-Inflicted Wound of Suffering

Last month, I set us on a course of seeking to understand Christmas in a far deeper and richer way, as we ponder the value of the incarnation (God's taking on human flesh with its corrupt and rotting nature) and the profound gift of God's confirmed love for a fallen humanity. We considered how slow and dedicated Evil is that makes it all-the-more "evil," and something to constantly to be called to our attention as we go, because it convinces us that we are not what scripture itself declares we are – ALL sheep gone astray, deserving the death and separation of God for all eternity.

As I have pondered this and November's letters, I began a detailed reading from the Genesis, because as Julie Andrew's character Maria declared, "Let's start at the very beginning, it's a very good place to start. When you read you begin with" Genesis and a GOOD and even Very GOOD creation with God's crowing creation, mankind, set into the midst of the garden. Then comes chapter 3. We see God has and only can make Good. THAT's IT. And yet just as Light can only be defined against Dark, so with Good, evil and darkness lay in the wings.

I had never caught it before, because just like everyone, we get the idea in "over known texts" of scripture that we understand what is going on, and then, in the insidious nature of evil, we simplify, read over, cut off, or assume (and you know what that means) that we have this scripture thing down pat. Buzzer sound inserted here. In fact, I always lead into study of the Bible with the reminder of 2 things: first, we should always assume that the last time we read it we could have been wrong, and second, that we should always read as if we have never read before so that we carefully pay attention to each word.

In the account of the fall, I have always taken it that Adam, Eve, and the "serpent" made a mess and, in response and revenge, God cursed them and the world as a punishment. But that's not what it says. Look again at the above quote from Genesis. Look at **Genesis 3: 14 - 15**. In fact, God does curse the serpent, and declares that it has become more cursed than the rest of creation; yet in the very next line God declares a promise of healing what the serpents lies have created, with the promise of an offspring who would crush his head, and the worst that he could do was bite His heal.

But to Adam, and Eve, God declares "because they have listened to other voices" than God's, they unleashed exactly what He had warned them would come from choosing to go in a way other than His. The thing they have opened the door to and allowed run free unchecked is the chaos that God had put into order in creation. They released death into the creation, and all the different ways that death makes itself known. It is quite simply a self-inflicted wound. James declares it quite poignantly that each person still bears in themselves the evil desires and the ability to be enticed away from God's way by simply listening to another voice, their own fallen one, rather than God's voice of truth.

It is fascinating how easily we get swayed and led away from recognizing our own contribution in this affair, and how deep culture's influence is and the world's desire to destroy. If old enough, you might remember the one line that has fed Christians and non-Christians to this day to think they are not responsible for the mess in which we

exist. (*Take no responsibility or accountability*) The line came from Flip Wilson's character Geraldine. The quote, "**The Devil MADE me do it.**" Not according to James, and the rest of scripture. In fact, the only thing, as in Genesis 3, that Satan can do is issue lies and wave carrots before our noses. Our inborn hearts of evil and self-ishness does the rest, and it leads to where? Death! No wonder why Jesus calls him a deceiver and the Father of lies.

God knows from the moment He walks back into the garden, if not before, that something has changed. Adam and Eve aren't out in the open and exposed to His gaze that admired their beauty as His marvelous creation. Instead, they were hiding and had made covers of leaves (*which will dry out and crumble and need to be made again*) and they more than anything were now afraid of God's voice rather than desiring to hear all He had to say.

The corruption continues still today as we play the blame game when exposed or flat out deny (*like an addict*) that we don't have any problems somehow believing that we stand before God proudly because we have nothing to hide. Yet, people still hide, they ignore God's Word, we try to cover ourselves with cheap faltering covers that cannot help but crumble before the truth, and we know it. That pain inflicted on others because of your feelings, that failing that exposes you when it comes to light, that short fuse, that gossipy nature, that mumbling inner hatred of others, that despising and looking down on others because they don't measure up – all self-inflicted wounds; and together we all continue to create suffering for ourselves, and in our suffering, we inflict it on others. Hurt people hurt people.

Does it seem that the suffering, depression, struggles, fears and addictions seem to be getting stronger and more pronounced in every passing day? Paul describes it as a know war going on within himself (his members) and asks where will relief come from? **BUT...GOD**



"Lord, teach us to pray" Luke 11:1 (Part 11)



We can have as many how-to books as we want. We can try as many practical solutions as we can find. But to start there is to start from the wrong end. It is to God, that we go to first, and out of the abundance of his provision and in anticipation of that wonderful day when we are living in his full, unshielded glory, all the other things fall into line. The Apostle Paul writes that he is praying that we would be animated and excited each day by the prospect of your glorious inheritance. But that's not all. Our inheritance is God. And God's inheritance is us. As our oldest Grandson Tyson used to say when he was about 4 or 5 years old, "I bet you didn't see that coming!" We are God's inheritance!! Some biblical experts are divided over the nature of the word "inheritance" as found in Ephesians 1:18. Here is reads, "I pray that your hearts will be flooded with light so that you can understand the confident hope he has given to those he called – his holy people who are his rich and glorious inheritance." Now you can read that as regarding the inheritance with is ours - God. And you can also read it as speaking of the inheritance which God has prepared for himself – us. The notions are two sides of one coin. They're not mutually exclusive. God has an inheritance in his people, and we have an inheritance in Christ. From this side of the coin, Paul is referring to the fact that the Father has promised the Son an inheritance – and that inheritance is made up of all who are in Christ. In Malachi, the prophet put it this way in chapter 3, verses 16 and 17: "Then those who feared the Lord spoke with each other, and the Lord listened to what they said. In his presence, a scroll of remembrance was written to record the names of those who feared him and always thought about the honor of his name. 'They will be my people,' says the Lord of Heaven's Armies. 'On the day when I act in judgement, they will be my own special treasure. I will spare them as a father spares an obedient child." And in Psalm 33:12 we read this: "What a joy for the nation whose God is the Lord, whose people he has chosen as his inheritance." So, in this Old Testament picture we have God seeing in he people and inheritance that is his.
