

Harvesting Learning from this Year

Again, this year I was blessed to ride along for several hours with those who work the land as they bring in a “harvest of the seeds that were sown;” which I find enjoyable and worthwhile with members of the body. I also find that as I continue in my own life to study and dig in the Word of God, almost everything I do comes back in reflection on God’s Word revealing more of His will and desire for my life. Saint and sinner that I am, the Spirit is constantly talking to me to grow and nurture this seed that was planted in baptism, until it comes to the time of the harvest.

As I was riding during the bean harvest and talking about the differences between corn and soybeans and the way they are harvested I learned that corn gets brought in rows, just as it was planted. Beans on the other hand are harvested against the “grain” if you will. The combine is run at an angle to the way the rows as they are planted. There are various reasons but I’m considering the reflection I had though. Corn goes in and comes out, for lack of a better way, easily – in and out in lines. Beans go in in lines, but the harvest cuts against the rows, the hard way so that the harvest doesn’t get messed up.

Maybe that’s why Stephen King wrote the book Children of the Corn and not Kids of the Beans. A story of scary and horrific stuff that comes out of the corn, because there are plenty of ways to hide and the easy way leads to more troubles than one would like to believe. Plus, beans are too short to hide in anyway. But the real thought here is that nothing in scriptures tells us that there is an easy way. Our salvation and hope have been made easy by Jesus’ gift of death and resurrection for us, but that certainly wasn’t easy. Even more, to follow Christ never is easy either. Jesus talks about dying to life, giving up to gain, being last to be first and so much more, yet all these things go against our grain and against the world’s way. As one who is baptized, washed and united to Christ, we are meant to be against the grain people. I heard it the other day – we are made to be weird to the world. We are meant to stand out. The more we try to conform to the world for success, number, ease the more we lose ourselves and our closeness to Christ.

Toby Mac, I believe sang the song, with the lyrics “I don’t want to gain the whole world and lose my soul.” Jesus’s words that remind us that faith is not an easy road but one that will kill us so we might live. The more we seek to join in the world’s way, become innovative or creative with faith because we are more worried about success in number rather than souls growing deep in faith, we are losing. We are invited to be WEIRD, to cut against the grain, to stand out rather than join in, and God has provided the tools and ways for us to be part of a bountiful

...harvest at His return. The Ephesians text above shows us the way God grows and brings His harvest to overflow His barns. He creates a body and puts all the parts in such a necessary relationship for the purpose of helping us not to conform to the world's way; to help each other not be led into troubling waters that wash us out to sea and toss us about, but rather holds us back to our against the grain way we are to exist, because Christ is certainly against the grain.

Jesus has cut across the grain for us, removing the harvest of death we were planted in, and He has marked us to go against

the grain with Him. It is hard. We do fail. 

So, how can we possibly have an understanding of God’s power in our inner being? How could we really have our eyes fixed on Christ and upon eternity? How could we know God in such and intimate way? How could we be filled up with all of his fullness? How could our brothers and sisters in our church experience all of those things? We will not pray bigger, and better if we start to pay any attention to the voice that produces doubts that any of this can really happen, and doubts that prayer really makes any difference. So, can we make all this happen? Can we do better? The answer to both of those questions is, we can’t. But there is a second part to the answer, and that is; but the guiding and teaching of the Holy Spirit, we can change, as the Spirit, which is co-equal and co-eternal with God the Father, God the Son, goes to work to strengthen us, “with power in your inner being through his Spirit,” (Ephesians 3:16). As a Christian, we change as the Spirit brings home to our lives, and makes real in our lives, the truth concerning God. And by knowing this and trusting in this, it will prove more effective in bringing us to pray bigger and better than any new resolution or new routine ever can. We need to know the power of the Holy Spirit. To find living proof of the power of the Spirit, all we need to do is go take a look in a mirror. It was the work of the Holy Spirit that convicted the person looking back at us of our sins. We may have agreed that yes, there were problems in our life, but they weren’t really that bad. Especially when we compared them to the problems of other people that we know. We may have even determined that if God were grading on the curve, we would be perfectly fine. But then we begin to see ourselves in a different light. We began to read the Bible, and we started to find that the Bible seemed to understand us better than we did ourselves, and in a way that we couldn’t fully comprehend. It was as if the Bible was speaking directly to us. It was as if the Bible was diagnosing us, and was saying, now this is you right here you see. And in Romans 3:23 it tells us, “For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.”; rather than fighting back or disagreeing with that, we find ourselves saying, “Well, that includes me”. Where before, we may have said, “Well, that must include them”. This is the work of the Holy Spirit. This is the power of the Holy Spirit.
